

HURRICANE PREPARATION TIPS

HURRICANE SEASON IS JUNE 1ST TO NOVEMBER 30TH!

BEFORE A STORM:

- **PREPARE A PLAN:**
Make a plan to evacuate or shelter in place at home.
- **SIGN UP FOR NOLA READY EMERGENCY ALERTS:**
Text CRISTOBAL to 888777 or visit ready.nola.gov to sign up online.
- **IF ELIGIBLE, SIGN UP FOR THE CITY ASSISTED EVACUATION PLAN (CAEP):**
Dial 311, (504) 658-2299, or visit www.nola.gov/ready/evacuspots for more information. For TTY, dial (504) 586-4475.
- **RESEARCH SPECIAL NEEDS ASSISTANCE:**
Consult physicians, counselors, home health care agencies, and service providers to arrange care for your evacuation needs. Also, please remember to arrange suitable transportation as soon as possible.
- **DON'T FORGET YOUR PETS!**
Pack all necessities, including updated vaccination information, ID collar, leash, medications, and a carrier.

DURING A STORM:

- **YOU MUST EVACUATE IF:**
Mayor declares a mandatory evacuation. Evacuspots pick-up locations for HANO senior residents include:
 - **Arthur Mondy Center** - 1111 Newton Avenue, Algiers
 - **Kingsley House** - 1600 Constance Street, Lower Garden District
 - **Central City Senior Center** - 2101 Philip Street, Central City
 - **Mater Dolorosa** - 1226 S. Carrollton Avenue, Carrollton
- **PACK A SMALL EMERGENCY BAG:**
Include all necessary medications and prescriptions, identification, important documents, a few changes of clothing, and cash. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, you should also include face coverings, hand sanitizer, and disinfectants in your go-bag to prevent the spread while you are evacuated.
- **FOR MORE INFORMATION:**

***Follow the blue evacuation route signs, and head in the direction opposite of the storm track.*
